**What is it?:** A seminar and information day about pupillage focusing on how to apply for and obtain pupillage.

**Who may attend?:** Law Undergraduates who have started their degree by the autumn of 2024, GDL students and those undertaking or who have completed their BTC in the last five years.

**How do I apply:** Complete the Application Form and submit it as required by 4pm on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2024.

Who is this course designed for: Those who are considering applying for pupillage in England and Wales.

#### **FAQS:**

I want to undertake pupillage in an area of law that Devon Chambers does not focus on, can I still attend? We are a common law set and so we will focus on that. We will not be discussing the Chancery Bar or International Human Rights and so you may be better placed looking for a similar course from Chambers that cover the areas of law you are interested in.

I would like to attend but I can't make it to Plymouth as I am not in a position to pay for travel or overnight stays? We will have a number of funded places to assist those who would otherwise not be in a position to attend. Further details can be found on the Application Form.

I am just starting at University and wonder whether it is too soon to be thinking about pupillage? It is never too soon, from the courses that you undertake to the mini-pupillages you apply for, it is never too soon to obtain guidance on pursuing pupillage.

**Is there an age limit?** Yes, you must be 18 or over on the date of the Seminar.

Will there be parking? There will not be parking at Devon Chambers on the day but there are a number of car parks nearby and we are only a short walk from the train station.

I am not sure if I want to apply to Devon Chambers for pupillage, can I still attend? Whilst we would like you all to apply to Devon Chambers for pupillage we understand that that is not always possible. Hopefully you will still find the day helpful.
